8:1	And God remembered Noah, and every living thing, and all the cattle that was with him in the ark:
	and God made a wind to pass over the earth,
	and the waters asswaged;
8:2	The fountains also of the deep and the windows of heaven were stopped, and the rain from heaven was
	restrained;
8:3	And the waters returned from off the earth continually:
	and after the end of the hundred and fifty days the waters were abated.
	thought: Now, the deep is allowed to recollect its water, and this, thereby, lowers the level of the
	flooding waters of the earth.

	in the tenth month, on the first day of the month, were the tops of the mountains seen.

8:6	And it came to pass at the end of forty days,
07	that Noah opened the window of the ark which he had made:
8:7	And he sent forth a raven,
	which went forth to and fro, until the waters were dried up from off the earth. IMPRESSIVE!
	thought: relative date = November 10, 600
8:8	Also he sent forth a dove from him, to see if the waters were abated from off the face of the ground;
8:9	But the dove found no rest for the sole of her foot, and she returned unto him into the ark, for the waters
	were on the face of the whole earth: then he put forth his hand, and took her, and pulled her in unto him
	into the ark.
	thought: relative date = December 18, 600
8:10	And he stayed yet other seven days;
	and again he sent forth the dove out of the ark;
8:11	And the dove came in to him in the evening; and, lo, in her mouth was an olive leaf plucked off:
	so Noah knew that the waters were abated from off the earth.
	thought: relative date = December 25, 600
8:12	And he stayed yet other seven days;
	and sent forth the dove; which returned not again unto him any more.
0.10	thought: $relative date = January 1, 601$
8:13	And it came to pass in the six hundredth and first year, in the first month, the first day of the month, the
	waters were dried up from off the earth:
	and Noah removed the covering of the ark, and looked, and, behold, the face of the ground was dry.
8:14	And in the second month, on the seven and twentieth day of the month, was the earth dried.
	thought: $relative date = February 27, 601$
0.15	And God snake unto Nech serving
8:15	And God spake unto Noah, saying,
8:16	Go forth of the ark, thou, and thy wife, and thy sons, and thy sons' wives with thee.
8:17	Bring forth with thee every living thing that is with thee, of all flesh, both of fowl, and of cattle, and of
	every creeping thing that creepeth upon the earth; that they may breed abundantly in the earth, and be
	fruitful, and multiply upon the earth.

8:18 <u>And Noah went forth</u>, and his sons, and his wife, and his sons' wives with him:

- 8:19 Every beast, every creeping thing, and every fowl, and whatsoever creepeth upon the earth, after their kinds, went forth out of the ark.
- 8:20 And *Noah* builded an altar unto the LORD;

and took of every clean beast, and of every clean fowl, and offered burnt offerings on the altar.

thought: Reference the question at 7:2: (By sevens: This may be a 'utility' criterion) It may have been that, God commanded the, 'by sevens', in anticipation of this action of Noah's; so that, at least two of every clean beast would be preserved. And thinking further in the timeframe (about a half year's residence in the ark), Noah would also have found these extra creatures useful for the food supply of his family and, possibly, some of the carnivorous animals--as well as, maybe even, some ones of the flesh eating birds--such as might be required during the journey.

- 8:21 And the LORD smelled a sweet savour; and the LORD said in his heart, I will not again curse the ground any more for man's sake; for the imagination of man's heart is evil from his youth; neither will I again smite any more every thing living, as I have done.
- 8:22 While the earth remaineth, seedtime and harvest, and cold and heat, and summer and winter, and day and night shall not cease.
